

 Peach, b. Boston, MA 18 January 1957; d. Washington, DC 25 July 2008, of complications from a recurrence of breast cancer. A professor of philosophy at American University, she is survived by her parents, her brother John and her sister, Rebecca Cooke.

Note: While the Social Security Death Index [SSDI] is a major source of death information; the listing gives only a name, a birth date, a death date, sometimes a place of death, and sometimes a place of last payment, so obituaries and other notices are gratefully received. 57 Hartwell deaths were reported on the SSDI in 2008; only 11 (noted above) have been identified.

TRYING TO IDENTIFY AN "UNATTACHED" HARTWELL

Eleanor Pinkney Gilbert kindly sent me a newspaper obituary for Gordon A. Hartwell, who is also listed on the SSDI. I could

not identify him, but did get him back to his possible greatgrandparents, so thought it might be interesting to relate the process used. The SSDI, census records and some Massachusetts vital records, helped me get back to 1884. If anyone has further information on this Hartwell family, I would appreciate knowing it.

GORDON A. HARTWELL, son of Edwin and Margaret (Durand) Hartwell, was born at Lebanon, NH, 28 September 1934 and died at Hillsborough, NH, 10 November 2008. He was a veteran of the US Air Force and a member of American Legion Post #59. He worked in the grocery industry his entire career and was a lifelong Boston Red Sox and Boston Celtics fan. He coached Keene Little League for many years. Survived by his wife, MARY E. () HARTWELL, two sons, two daughters, three grandsons, three nephews and many cousins [all information from the obit. sent by Eleanor (Hartwell) (Pinkney) Gilbert].

The Social Security Death Index and a Mass. Vital Record provided the following information on Gordon's family:

EDWIN JOHN HARTWELL was born prob. at Keene, NH, 23 July 1909 and died there 1 November 1991. He married, ca. 1928, MARGARET DURAND, who was born 14 October 1906 and d. at Keene, NH, -- July 1979.

Again, the SSDI, the 1930 census, plus a Mass. Vital Record, and a WWII record found online at the State Archives in Waltham, provided the following information on Edwin's fam-

Asa John Hartwell was born at Winchendon, MA, 10 March 1884 [MA VR 351:411] and he died after 1930 when he was enumerated on the federal census in Keene, NH. He married Annie (), who was born 21 December 1887 and died at Concord and/or Keene, NH in January of 1979 [SSDI]. Asa enrolled in WWII, stating he was a resident of Cheshire County, NH.

Asa John Hartwell's birth record lists him as an unnamed male child, born at Winchendon 10 March 1884 to Charles Hartwell "of Lowell" and Ella Ray/Roy "of Sutton." My research has reached a "brick wall" at this point, as I can find no marriage between a Charles and an Ella, except that of Charles to Ella Colby at Worcester, MA in 1876, and I have eliminated this couple as the possible parents of Asa John, since they had a child of their own born at Worcester 18 Oct. 1884! It's possible that Asa John's parents are incorrectly recorded on his birth record, and it's also possible that they were married somewhere other than Massachusetts, and I do not have that record. I have been unable to find death records for either John or Ella, both of whom probably died before the SSDI began listing deaths. There are no other births in Mass. recorded for this couple, so either Asa John was an only child or his parents moved somewhere else after his birth. Any help with this mysterious family would be greatly appreciated, as I do feel that they somehow "attach" to William¹ of Concord.

Minutes of the 2008 Annual Meeting of the Hartwells of America

Saturday, June 28, 2008, saw thirty-some Hartwell cousins and friends convene at the Trinitarian Congregational Church, Concord, MA for the Hartwells of America Association's 71st Anniversary Reunion. As noted in last year's Newsletter, the change in venue from the First Parish in Concord Church, where the Association has met the past several summers, was occasioned by on-going renovations at that location.

President Wayne E. Hartwell (Foxborough, MA) called the business meeting to order at 1:00 p.m., noting that it was the 25th consecutive year that he has performed that duty.

Roger Whitcher Hartwell (Quincy, MA) offered an opening prayer, which was followed by a moment of silence in memory of Hartwell cousins departed since the last Reunion.

First-time Reunion attendees were welcomed: Marcia and Corky Cronin, San Leandro, CA; and Mike, Michele, Lynn, and Austin Cronin, Danville, CA.

Marian H. Wheeler (Concord, MA), our hostess at First Parish and Trinitarian, was presented with a copy of Joy Peach's new Genealogy in recognition of her dedicated efforts on behalf of the Association.

The minutes of the 2007 business meeting, as published in the 2008 Newsletter, were accepted.

David Hartwell Webber (Dunstable, MA) delivered the Treasurer's report. As of the close of the Association's 2008 Fiscal Year, the balance on hand in the Scholarship Fund was a respectable \$12,906 (that Fund received donations of \$1,119 during the Fiscal Year). The Operating Fund, which finances the Reunion, Newsletter, and other Association operating expenses, contained \$2,374. Revenue to the Operating Fund for the year, from bank interest, dues, and the sale of Hartwell literature, was \$539, while operating expenses for the year totaled \$1,035. David projected that the recent string of annual operating deficits would likely be offset by the increase in annual dues voted at the 2007 Reunion (from \$2 to \$5), which became effective as of July 1 for the 2009 Fiscal Year. David also reported that copies of Joy's new Genealogy were not exactly flying off the shelves, with approximately 80 more sales necessary to recoup the Association's expenses of publication. David noted that Richard Hartwell Negus (Dunwoody, GA) had generously purchased a copy for donation to the Concord Library, and suggested that others do the same for their local libraries as a way to stimulate sales. On motion, David's report was accepted.

Scholarship Committee Chairperson Victoria H.C. Rogers (Otisfield, ME) reported that the committee had voted to award \$150 Scholarship Grants to Katherine Lynn Orfao (Westborough, MA) who is pursuing a degree in Cosmetology at the Cosmix International School of Hair & Nail Design, and Michael Orfao (Worcester, MA), who is working toward a degree in Biology at Worcester State College. On motion, Vickie's report was accepted.

Genealogist Joy F. Peach (Lancaster, MA) brought the meeting up to date on her latest finds and her continuing work on the generations following the fifth, as contained in the new Genealogy. On motion, Joy's report was accepted.

Contributions were voted to Trinitarian for the use of its facilities (\$200) and attendance of its Sexton (\$50), and to the Social Law Library for the efforts

of the Library's graphic designer in preparing the Association's Newsletter (\$50).

As the person traveling the farthest to attend, Marcia Cronin received a Hartwell Tavern, 71st Anniversary Reunion Memorial T-Shirt. The eldest lady in attendance, Marian Wheeler (93), also received a T-shirt to recognize that achievement. A T-shirt for the eldest gentleman in attendance went to Warren Hartwell (Swampscott, MA). Austin Cronin garnered a T-shirt as the youngest attendee.

Following the conclusion of the formal business meeting, attendees gathered for a group photo by Association Photographer, Alison Hartwell (Quincy, MA).
